CURLY FLAT PINOT NOIRS

Although they were not eligible for the 2014 Winewise Championship, two fascinating pinot noirs came my way during the hectic weeks prior to the event.

The tales of 2011 vintage woe spread quickly from central and highland Victoria. However we've pointed out the folly of vintage generalisations before, and these two Curly Flat Pinot Noirs from the Macedon Ranges support that view.

2011 Curly Flat Pinot Noir There's a hint of whole bunch complexity here, but the main feature of the bouquet is fresh raspberry. The palate isn't at the big end of the pinot noir spectrum, but it definitely has length, and the fine, savoury tannins are impressive and ripe. Cellar 2-4 years. *Highly Recommended*

2011 Curly Flat "The Curly" Pinot Noir This wine has a little more stems complexity, and there's impressive fruit drive on the fine palate which features silky tannins. It will also benefit from cellaring. *Highly Recommended*

Well done Phillip Moraghan. This pair of wines add even more "cred" to an ever-growing reputation.

2012-13 Tasmanian Riesling

2013 Leo Buring Leopold Riesling A classic example of dry Tasmanian riesling. It's a high acid style with lemony and slatey overtones, and it verges on being austere. (\$44.00) **HR**

2012 Pressing Matters R9 Riesling An intense yet restrained and aromatic style with hints of citrus. There's a suggestion of sweetness which is neutralised by racy acidity. (\$33.00) **HR**

2012 Riversdale Estate Cygnus Riesling This is an impressive citrus/floral riesling with a long, beautifully balanced, dry palate. (\$28.00) **HR**

2012 Richard Meyman Wines Waseca Riesling There are hints of Rheingau-like aromatics here, and the long palate finishes with crisp acidity. (\$22.00) **HR**

A classy foursome indeed, with very little between them. Regardless of sub region Tasmania produces rieslings with comparatively high acidity. Some, like the Leo Buring, are made bone dry. This style can only be successful if there is considerable fruit intensity. That is indeed the case with all four wines.

2013 Peter Lehmann Wigan Riesling Although it's comparatively closed at the moment, there's a lot below the surface of this riesling. The long, dry palate has all the intensity and acidity required for long term cellaring. A sleeper. (Not yet released) **Os**

2013 Leo Buring Leonay Mature Release Eden Valley Riesling Surprisingly full flavoured and spicy. Nevertheless there's enough acidity to support cellaring. (Not yet released) **HR**

2013 Paracombe Wines Holland Creek Riesling Very reserved on the nose and the palate is very delicate. Needs time to build up. (\$20.00) R

2013 Longview Iron Knob Riesling Strong Granny Smith apple aroma. The palate is fresh but needs more weight. (\$19.50) **R**

2013 Forbes Wine Company Eden Valley Riesling Very closed up, showing itself grudgingly at the moment. (\$20.00) **R**

2013 Great Southern & Geographe Riesling

2013 Duke's Magpie Hill Riesling The combination of power and restraint in this wine is captivating. Delicate floral aromas carry through to an impressive dry, minerally palate. Cellar five years at least. (\$27.00) **Os**

2013 Bellarmine Riesling Dry Pronounced passionfruit and citrus aromas signal a rich palate. The abundant fruit is supported by excellent acidity. (\$24.00) **HR**

2013 Rockcliffe Single Site Riesling This is a fresh floral/lime style with a stylish dry, linear palate. Cellar this one. (\$28.00) **HR**

2013 Talisman Riesling A fresh, slightly grassy riesling with good weight of fruit. Short term. (\$20.00) **R**

2013 Abbey Creek Riesling The palate offers generous citrus-like flavour and lively acidity, but the nose is slightly dull.

2012 Ducketts Mill Riesling No doubt about it, this is the type of riesling that drives the reputation of Great Southern onwards. It's racy, steely, delicate and, at the same time intensely varietal. (Not yet released, but likely to be about \$17.00) **Os**

2013 Clonakilla Riesling A marvellously delicate, perfumed riesling which is almost fragile. Picture very fine glass blown into a particularly graceful shape. It's delicate, but not weak. Cellar 5-10 years. (\$27.00) **Os**

2013 Shaw Vineyard Estate Riesling Too developed, showing some volatile acidity. (\$22.50) **Ac**
