From the “old” favourite cabernet sauvignon to all manner of “new” varietals, this part of the Championship is full of excellent wines and, more importantly, bargains. Put some spice into your life and try something different – nero d’avola or graciano perhaps – and don’t forget malbec. It’s been grown in Australia since the 19th century, but to many it’s a newcomer.

2014 CABERNET SAUVIGNON

2014 Montgomery's Hill Cabernet Sauvignon This Albany, WA wine offers more than ample blackcurrant fruit backed up by slightly toasty oak. ★★★★★

2014 Moppity Vineyards Estate Hilltops Cabernet Sauvignon A ripe varietal red showing cassis aromas and flavours with a hint of leaf. Oak shows on the finish. ★★★★★

2014 Moppity Vineyards Lock & Key Hilltops Cabernet Sauvignon The red fruits carry a little varietal leafiness and are supported by firm tannins. ★★★★★

2014 Moppity Vineyards Reserve Hilltops Cabernet Sauvignon A firmly structured, classic cabernet sauvignon with considerable varietal intensity. It’s very closed at the moment. ★★★★★

2014 After Hours Margaret River Cabernet Sauvignon A little light, but it’s balanced and has adequate fruit weight. ★★★★★

2014 Maygars Hill Cabernet A simple red that is quite leafy. ★★★★★

Cabernet sauvignon seldom shines when it’s this young. All the wines above will benefit from time in bottle.

2013 CABERNET SAUVIGNON GROUP 1

2013 Wolf Blass Gold Label Coonawarra Cabernet Sauvignon An intense cassis/cedar style of cabernet with excellent length and fine, persistent tannins. (\$22.00) ★★★★★

2013 Majella Coonawarra Cabernet This is a powerful cabernet showing cassis and leaf together with toasty oak. A substantial Coonawarra. (\$32.00) ★★★★★

2013 St Huberts Yarra Valley Cabernet Sauvignon Rich, ripe and varietal, with very good structure. ★★★★★

2013 Pepper Tree Calcare Coonawarra Cabernet Sauvignon Rich cassis aromas and flavours show a hint of mint. It's very fresh and balanced. ★★★★★

2013 Karrawatta Christo's Paddock Cabernet Sauvignon A big, fresh varietal red with its share of oak. ★★★★★

2013 Mandoon Estate Research Station Reserve Margaret River Cabernet Sauvignon Comparatively light, but varietal, with a vegetal edge. ★★★

2013 CABERNET SAUVIGNON GROUP 2

2013 Sittella Margaret River Berns Reserve The cassis aroma and flavour is pronounced, and the oak is spot-on. This wine encapsulates everything that Margaret River cabernet sauvignon stands for. (\$44.95) ★★★★★

2013 Bleasdale Iron Duke Langhorne Creek Cabernet Sauvignon Langhorne Creek is a very under-rated cabernet region, and this wine makes a strong case for the region. It shows powerful cassis varietal character backed up by fine tannins and a suggestion of oak. ★★★★★

2013 Pepperjack Barossa Cabernet Sauvignon Attractively fresh and varietal, with pleasing richness on a firm, balanced palate. ★★★★★

2013 Rosemount Diamond Label Cabernet Sauvignon There's no shortage of bright blackcurrant fruit here. Fresh acidity lifts the finish. ★★★★★

2013 Lindemans St George Coonawarra Cabernet Sauvignon The intense varietal fruit is impressive but it has a lot of oak to carry at the moment. ★★★★★

2013 CABERNET SAUVIGNON GROUP 3

2013 De Bortoli Estate Grown Yarra Valley Cabernet Sauvignon Here's a true cabernet sauvignon in all respects – blackcurrant, tobacco leaf and firm, fine tannins on a long palate. ★★★★★

2013 Annie's Lane The Locals Polish Hill Cabernet Sauvignon The aromas lean slightly more to red berries than blackcurrant, but this is still strongly varietal, right down to the hint of leaf and the classic tannins. ★★★★★

2013 Montara Gold Rush Grampians Cabernet Sauvignon A complex blackcurrant/cedar style of cabernet with beautifully balanced, fine, savoury tannins. (\$25.00) ★★★★★☆

2013 Yalumba Menzies The Cigar Coonawarra Cabernet Sauvignon Shows strong varietal characteristics, but is a little forward in colour and flavour. ★★★★★

2013 Pepper Tree Block 21A Wrattenbully Cabernet Sauvignon A powerful cassis-scented cabernet with overtones of mint and oak. ★★★★★

2013 CABERNET SAUVIGNON GROUP 4

2013 Devils Lair Margaret River Cabernet Sauvignon This is a very powerful cabernet with tannins to match. The nose hints at dark chocolate, and oak comes through on the finish. Cellar 5+ years. (\$44.00) ★★★★★☆

2013 Xanadu Margaret River Cabernet Sauvignon An attractive varietal wine which has the classic blackcurrant and leaf characteristics. The tannins are particularly fine. (\$30.00) ★★★★★☆

2013 Pepper Tree Elderslee Road Wrattenbully Cabernet Sauvignon This is a very fresh, concentrated cabernet which is strongly varietal and built for cellaring. (\$20.00) ★★★★★☆

2013 Bull At A Gate Gippsland Cabernet Sauvignon Comparatively light colour. The leafy aromas and flavours are too prominent. ★★★

2013 Banks Thargo Coonawarra Cabernet Sauvignon Slightly jammy but still shows leafiness in an awkward meeting of aromas and flavours. ★★★

2013 De Bortoli Melba Reserve Yarra Valley Cabernet Sauvignon The fresh blackcurrant aroma is greatly enhanced by some oak, leaf and dried herbs. The palate is long, with very fine, persistent tannins. Classic cabernet. ★★★★★☆

2013 Davis Premium Vineyards Stonefields Block 22 Wrattenbully Cabernet Sauvignon A delightful cabernet that ticks all the boxes – vibrant varietal aromatics and flavour – impressive intensity and structure. ★★★★★☆

2013 St Aidan Cabernet Sauvignon Rich, ripe and fairly oaky. ★★★

2013 Brangayne of Orange Cabernet Sauvignon Weak colour. A light, vegetal red. ★★

2012 CABERNET SAUVIGNON GROUP I

2012 Saltram Edward Salter Cabernet Sauvignon There's no shortage of varietal character in this bottling from Saltram. Blackcurrant, dried herbs and tobacco leaf aromas are apparent. The palate is quite tight, with fine, drying tannins. ★★★★★

2012 Wynns Single Vineyard Childs Coonawarra Cabernet Sauvignon Rich and ripe, but packed with cassis varietal character. The tannins are quite solid at the moment, and the oak shows out. Cellar 5-10 years for best results. ★★★★★

2012 Xanadu Margaret River Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon Unmistakeably varietal, showing blackcurrant, red berry and tobacco leaf in an elegant style. ★★★★★

2012 Blue Pyrenees Estate Richardson Cabernet Sauvignon A very powerful cabernet packed with intense cassis flavour. It's shrunk back into its shell since we last tasted it, and the oak is prominent at the moment, but time is all this wine requires. ★★★★★

2012 Majella Coonawarra Cabernet The generous varietal flavour is backed up by obvious oak which sits comfortably with the fruit and tannins. ★★★★★

2012 CABERNET SAUVIGNON GROUP 2

2012 Reilly's Wines Dry Land Clare Valley Cabernet Sauvignon A very classy cabernet indeed, with both power and finesse. Fine, firm tannins provide an ideal framework for the vibrant blackcurrant fruit. (\$29.00) ★★★★★☆

2012 Ringbolt 21 Barriques Margaret River Cabernet Sauvignon The stamp of Margaret River is clearly discernible on this stylish, firmly structured cabernet. The long-lasting blackcurrant and tobacco leaf flavours are very impressive. ★★★★★☆

2012 Saltram Mamre Brook Barossa Cabernet Sauvignon A powerful, ripe, fresh cabernet with considerable depth of varietal cassis flavour backed up by well balanced tannins. ★★★★★☆

2012 Lindemans St George Coonawarra Cabernet Sauvignon Intense and stylish, with a hint of regional mint enhancing the clear-cut varietal character. Some new oak is evident. (\$49.00) ★★★★★☆

2012 Watershed Awakening Margaret River Cabernet Sauvignon Quite herbal. Very firm on the finish. ★★★☆

The Reilly's and Ringbolt cabernets could not be split, so both went through to the final.

2010 Saltram Mamre Brook Barossa Cabernet Sauvignon Barossa cabernet? Amazing! There are layers of fresh, luxurious cassis flavour with the support of high quality oak and firm, but polished tannins. It was a very close three-way vote, but this one prevailed courtesy of three top votes out of the six judges. ★★★★★

2011 Xanadu Margaret River Cabernet Sauvignon In style terms this one's the closest to Médoc. It's long, complex and dry, with very pleasant "dusty road" overtones. ★★★★★

2008 Wynns Black Label Coonawarra Cabernet Sauvignon Hints of bottle-age maturity add positively to the blackcurrant, cedar and tobacco overtones. The tannins are powdery and persistent. Very true to style. (\$32.00) ★★★★★

BORDEAUX BLENDS GROUP I

2013 Sandalford Margaret River Range Cabernet Merlot Margaret River has established itself as the stronghold of the cabernet merlot blend. This one is richly flavoured, with a solid tannin structure. It needs time to soften, and is a serious wine for the price. (\$19.00) ★★★★★

2012 Happs Three Hills Charles Andreas A very enjoyable Margaret River wine in which the red fruits flavours are nicely balanced by fine tannins. There's a strong merlot influence. ★★★★★

2013 Brangayne of Orange Tristan A slightly leafy plummy/blackcurrant style with fine, powdery tannins and well integrated oak. ★★★★★

2013 Lindemans Pyrus Coonawarra Cabernet Sauvignon Cabernet Franc Merlot A rich, ripe red with dark berry characteristics backed up by new oak and firm tannins. It needs time. ★★★★★

2010 Redman Coonawarra Cabernet Sauvignon Merlot Although there's no lack of flavour, there are mature leathery overtones. Drying tannins dominate the finish. ★★★

BORDEAUX BLENDS GROUP 2

2013 Sanguine Estate Heathcote Cabernet Sauvignon Cabernet Franc Petit Verdot A wine with plenty of power, showing overtones of red fruits, cassis and leaf. The tannins are fine and savoury. (\$24.95)

2013 Mandoon Estate Margaret River Cabernet Merlot An intense cassis/cedar style that is strong on regionality and freshness. A very well made wine. ★★★★★

2013 Ingoldby McLaren Vale Cabernet Shiraz Merlot A vibrant but substantial red that needs a few years in bottle. ★★★★★

2013 Juniper Crossing Margaret River Cabernet Merlot A fresh red fruits style with good palate weight and firm, fine tannins. ★★★★★

2013 Millbrook Margaret River Cabernet Sauvignon Malbec A big, ripe style that is a little simple. ★★★★★

BORDEAUX BLENDS GROUP 3

2014 Mandoon Estate Margaret River Cabernet Merlot This is a stunning young wine with aromas of red berries, plum and cedar. The impressive palate carries just enough oak to enhance the fruit flavours and the tannins are very fine. (\$30.50) ★★★★★

2014 Sandalford Margaret River Range Cabernet Merlot Very perfumed, showing violets, blackcurrant and leaf. The palate is satisfyingly long and fine. (\$20.00) ★★★★★

2014 Larry Cherubino Ad Hoc Avant Gardening Cabernet Malbec Very rich, fresh and plummy, with firm tannins and a touch of oak. A wine that makes a big impact but needs 2-3 years in bottle. ★★★★★

2014 Wignalls Cabernet Merlot Although it's on the light side, this wine offers pleasant drinking. ★★★★★

CLASSIC BLENDS GROUP I

2012 Lindemans Limestone Ridge Coonawarra Shiraz Cabernet This wine has magnificent, intense red and dark berry fruit. The tannins are firm but very well balanced and, although the oak is fairly prominent, we think it will integrate very well over time. (\$70.00) ★★★★★

2013 Rockcliffe Quarram Rocks Great Southern Shiraz Cabernet The dark berry flavour matches well with faintly toasty oak and the tannins are very well balanced. This classy wine is a Small Vigneron Awards trophy winner, and certainly lived up to that honour. (\$21.00)

2012 Wolf Blass Black Label Cabernet Shiraz A very impressive red blend in which the cabernet sauvignon dominates. It's a particularly intense wine, with the maker's signature oak showing out now, but it will merge in, given the extended cellaring that this wine deserves. (\$130.00)

2013 Pepperjack Shiraz Cabernet A rich, dark berry style with slightly spicy oak. The finish is firm but balanced. ★★★★★

2013 Bleasdale The Petrel Langhorne Creek This is a very appealing, opulent wine offering plum and cassis flavours on a supple palate. ★★★★★

2012 Sandhurst Ridge Classic Blend Plenty of dark berry fruit, with hints of char and mint. The finish is firm and long. ★★★★★

2013 Pepper Tree Strandlines Wrattenbully Cabernet Shiraz A very stylish interpretation of a great Aussie wine style. Both cabernet and shiraz characteristics are evident, and the beautifully balanced palate combines power and elegance. This wine should be in your cellar. (\$55.00) ★★★★★

2013 Lindemans Limestone Ridge Coonawarra Shiraz Cabernet Fresh and concentrated, with a hint of mint and a goodly dash of oak. The impressive palate is long, firm and powerful. ★★★★★☆

2014 Greg Norman Shiraz Cabernet The red berry aromas and flavours are fresh but a little simple. Nevertheless, this wine is drinking well. ★★★★★

2013 Moppity Atticus Cabernet Sauvignon Shiraz A very intense, but closed, red with firm tannins and obvious oak. It needs time. ★★★★★

2014 Willunga 100 McLaren Vale Cabernet Shiraz A very rich dark berry style of red with a firm finish. A good traditional version. ★★★★★

2014 Tyrrell's Vat 8 Shiraz Cabernet Supple and fresh, showing red berry aromas and flavours. ★★★★★

2014 Mandoon Estate Surveyor's Red This is a very drinkable Swan Valley red in the manner of a Côtes-du-Rhône. Red berry fruit fills the palate and the tannins are fine. Delicious. (\$22.50) ★★★★★☆

2013 Rosemount McLaren Vale Collection GSM The perfume of grenache is obvious on the nose and the palate has excellent weight and a fairly firm structure. Ideally it needs a couple of years in bottle. Unbelievable price. (\$10.00) ★★★★★

2013 Rosemount McLaren Vale GSM Grenache is definitely the leader here, but the other two varieties contribute dark berries and tannin. An impressive wine. (\$32.00) ★★★★★

2013 Sons of Eden Kennedy Fresh and aromatic, but the fruit weight isn't quite up to the tannins. ★★★★★

2014 Singlefile Clement V Shiraz Mataro Grenache Western Australia rises to the top again, much to the surprise of those who believe that South Australia "owns" grenache. This is a fragrant wine with generous flavour and supple tannins. Even though the grenache is in the minority, its perfume shows through. (\$31.00) ★★★★★

2014 Rosemount McLaren Vale GSM A wine of substance which is packed with red berry flavour balanced by fine, firm tannins. ★★★★★

2014 Bleasdale Langhorne Creek GSM Attractively perfumed and supple. Good drinking now. ★★★★★

2013 Bleasdale Langhorne Creek Broadside Fresh, fragrant, spicy and very drinkable, with the malbec component making its presence felt. What more could you want for the price? (\$13.00) ★★★★★

2014 Parous McLaren Vale Shiraz & Mataro A fascinating red offering plenty of flavour, with hints of licorice and dried herbs. The tannins are firm but balanced. ★★★★★

2013 Sieber Road Barossa Valley Shiraz Mataro There's no shortage of ripe flavour, but the oak is prominent. ★★★★★

2014 Ravensworth Hilltops Nebbiolo A vibrant young nebbiolo which shows some of the classic rose petal aroma. It's a delicious wine which has the varietal tannins, but they're very fine and not dominant. (\$33.00) ★★★★★

2013 Grove Estate Sommita Hilltops Nebbiolo The aromas and flavours are at the ripe end, but they're very fresh and matched by fine savoury tannins. (\$50.00) ★★★★★

2011 Topper's Mountain Nebbiolo The rose petal varietal aroma is engaging, but the fruit struggles with the tannins. ★★★

2014 Santolin Individual Vineyard Heathcote Nero d'Avola Here we see the enormous potential for nero d'avola in Australia. The dark cherry aromas have a hint of blackcurrant, and the palate is generous and long, with a good tannin balance. (\$34.00) ★★★★★

2014 Atze's Corner The Mob Barossa Valley Montepulciano This is a rich, concentrated wine packed with dark plum character. There's a hint of sweet oak that works well, and balanced tannins seal the deal. (\$28.00) ★★★★★

2014 Tintilla Saphira Hunter Valley Sangiovese The dark cherry aroma and flavour is backed up by a touch of oak, and the tannins are typically dry and savoury. A good varietal style. ★★★★★

2014 Balgownie Black Label Sangiovese The cherry and cherry stone characteristics on display in this wine are very typical of the variety. The palate delivers fruit weight and drying sangiovese tannins. ★★★★★

2015 Serafino Bellissimo McLaren Vale Montepulciano The extreme youth of the wine manifests itself in dramatic primary aromas and flavours that are plummy and very seductive. ★★★★★

2014 Mr Riggs Montepulciano d'Adelaide Hills Powerfully ripe and plummy – and very fresh. It may have finished last in the (very strong) group, but this is a wine well worth trying. ★★★★★

2014 Bakkheia The Groszman Graciano The Geographe region of WA is kicking some goals, and here's another one. This wine really has a Spanish touch about it. Licorice and earthy hints enhance the nose, and the palate is packed with flavour balanced by fine, savoury tannins. (\$25.00) ★★★★★☆

2014 Moppity Vineyards Lock & Key Reserve Hilltops Tempranillo The powerful dark berry characteristics have a salted licorice overtone which is quite attractive. The tannins are very fine. (\$27.00) ★★★★★☆

2013 Rudderless McLaren Vale Graciano The concentrated fresh dark berry flavour delivers what is expected of McLaren Vale. There are also hints of menthol and oak on the finish. ★★★★★

2014 Willunga 100 McLaren Vale Tempranillo A very rich dark berry style in which the "sweetness" of the fruit is nicely balanced by fine, savoury tannins. ★★★★★

GRACIANO OR TEMPRANILLO GROUP 2

2013 Juniper Crossing Margaret River Tempranillo The licorice of tempranillo adds to the vibrant dark berry aroma and flavour. Fine tannins make this wine very drinkable indeed. (\$17.90) ★★★★★☆

2015 Taylors Estate Tempranillo A delightful Australian version of the Spanish joven style. Vibrant, fruity and delicious. (\$19.00) ★★★★★☆

2014 Bakkheia Aequitas Tempranillo We enjoyed the fresh, perfumed dark berry characteristics of this Geographe wine. The palate is rich and supple. ★★★★★

2014 Tar + Roses Tempranillo Has plenty of flavour, but is a little jammy, with a dry finish. ★★★

2014 Gartelmann Joey Mudgee Merlot There's a subtle earthy complexity to this wine that is quite beguiling. The plummy fruit is balanced by fine, savoury tannins. ★★★★★

2013 Five Geese Sue's Paddock Reserve Grenache The fruit is very ripe, almost jammy, but this is a rich, mouthfilling red. ★★★★★

2015 Ravensworth Charlie Foxtrot Gamay Noir A very fresh wine that is just past rosé, with vibrant primary flavour. ★★★★★☆

2014 Bleasdale Second Innings Langhorne Creek Malbec There's no doubt that Langhorne Creek is malbec territory. The Argentinians feel that they own the variety, but this opulent blueberry/plum red makes a big statement for Australia. (\$20.00) ★★★★★

2014 Tamburlaine Reserve Malbec Orange, NSW is not exactly famed for malbec, but this wine shows that the variety can thrive at high altitude, just as it does near sea level at Langhorne Creek. The blueberry and rose petal aromas are enticing, and the palate is impressively long, with fine tannins. ★★★★★

2014 Atze's Corner The Giant Barossa Valley Durif A typically powerful, rich durif. Unlike many, it's also very fresh, and although the tannins are firm, they're balanced. The oak is a little prominent too. ★★★★★

2012 Palmer Margaret River Malbec This is a rich, plummy malbec with an attractive earthy edge. Oak and fine skin tannins support the fruit. ★★★★★

2013 Calabria Family 3 Bridges Durif A big, dense durif with plenty of oak. ★★★★★

2013 Wolf Blass Gold Label Coonawarra Cabernet Sauvignon
